

*Trust and obey, for there's no other way
To be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey.*

One night, in 1887, at a meeting in Massachusetts, a young man stood up to testify. He said, "I am not quite sure," meaning that he wasn't really certain that God would save him from his sins-and then he continued, "But I'm going to trust, and I'm going to obey"-meaning that he planned to trust God for his salvation and to do what he could to obey God's will.

Daniel Towner was the worship leader for that meeting. He was so impressed by the young man's testimony that he scribbled down those words and then wrote to a friend, John Sammis, telling him those words. Sammis then turned them into this great hymn, transforming those words into the chorus: "Trust and obey, For there's no other way To be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey."

Soon he had five verses to go with the chorus, and he sent them to Towner, who composed the tune that we still sing today.

But as for the young man whose quiet, spontaneous testimony inspired a hymn that has meant so much to millions of people all over the world, no one knows his name and I doubt he ever knew that his testimony would bear such fruit.

Personally, I can't think of a better life plan than to trust and to obey.
